Entries can be removed after 4:00 pm on Wednesday. Animals can be removed after 10:00 am Wednesday. Open Class and 4-H premium money will be paid from 11:00 - 1:00 pm on Wednesday.

Exhibitors are expected at all times to give necessary attention to what they have on exhibition and, at the close of the fair, take charge of the same. Diligence will be used by the Superintendents and Officers to prevent loss or injury, but in no case will the Association be responsible for accidents occurring during the fair.

Animals must be entered at the fair by noon on Monday to be eligible for support bids at the sale Wednesday. Market beef animals must be weighed by 12:00 noon.
